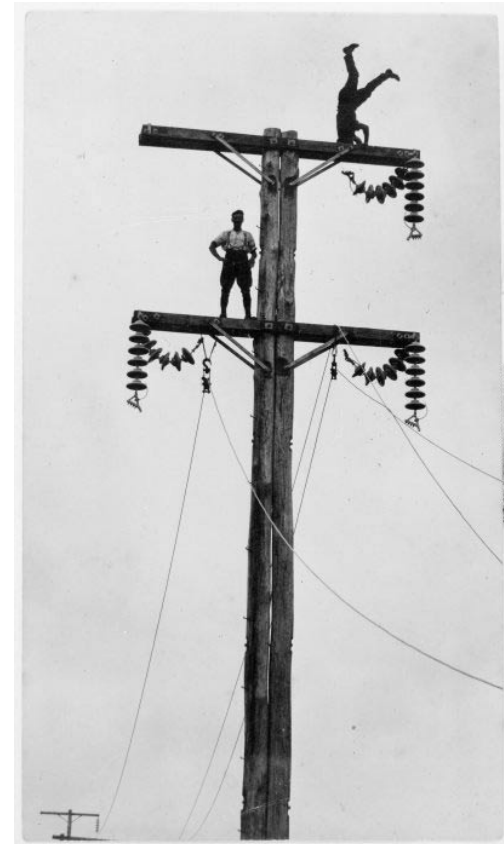

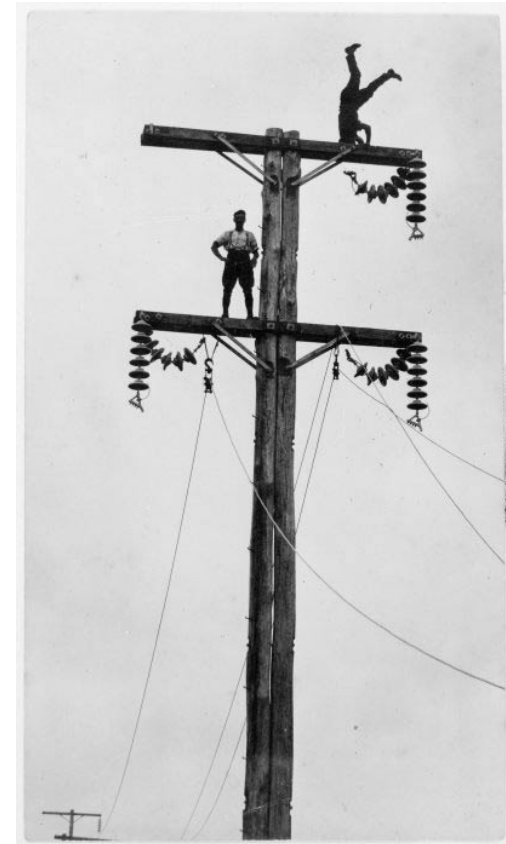
## About the Energy Library

- It started out in 1945 as the New Zealand Electricity Department Library, which had material dating from 1900.
- In 1987 it became the Electricity Corporation New Zealand (ECNZ) Library and Information Centre. In 1999, after ECNZ was split into three state owned enterprise companies, the Energy Library was set up.
- Our current membership includes both large and small companies. We have about 3000 borrowers.



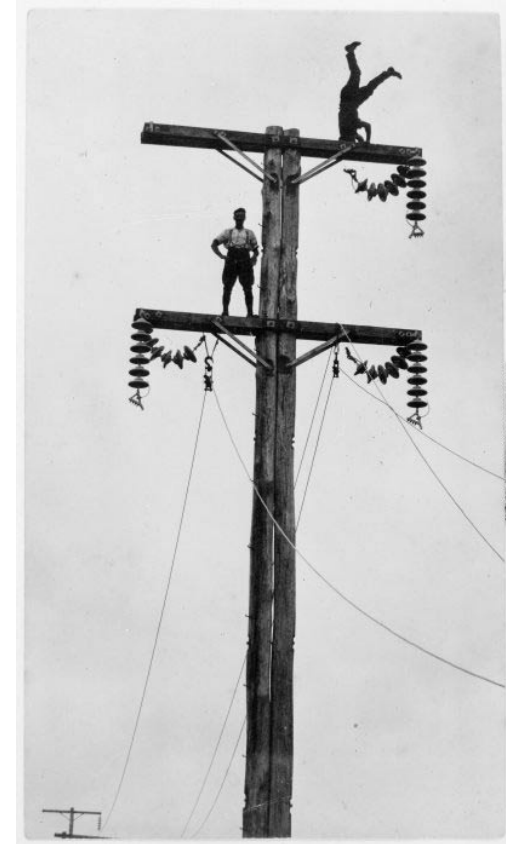
## What we do

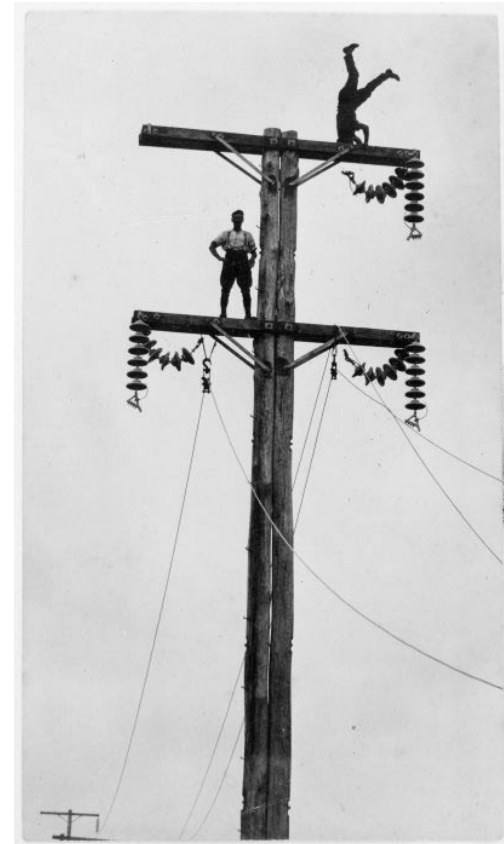
## Our collection covers

- Management, business and company information



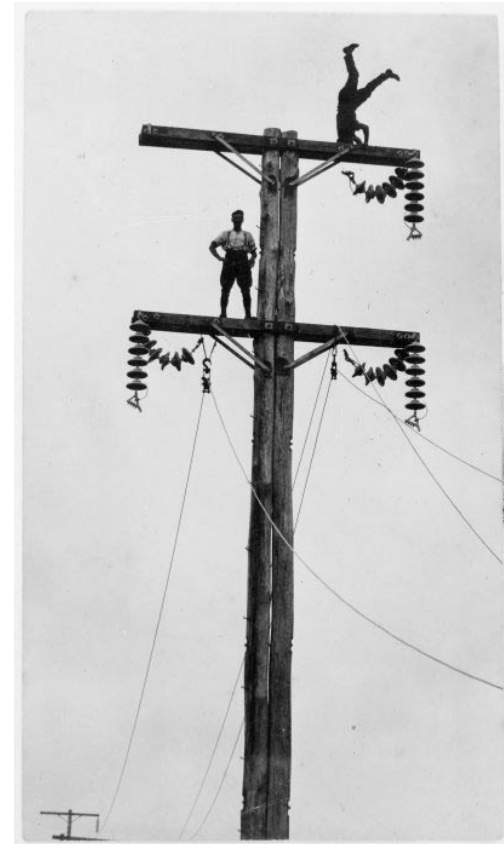

- EECA Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency collections



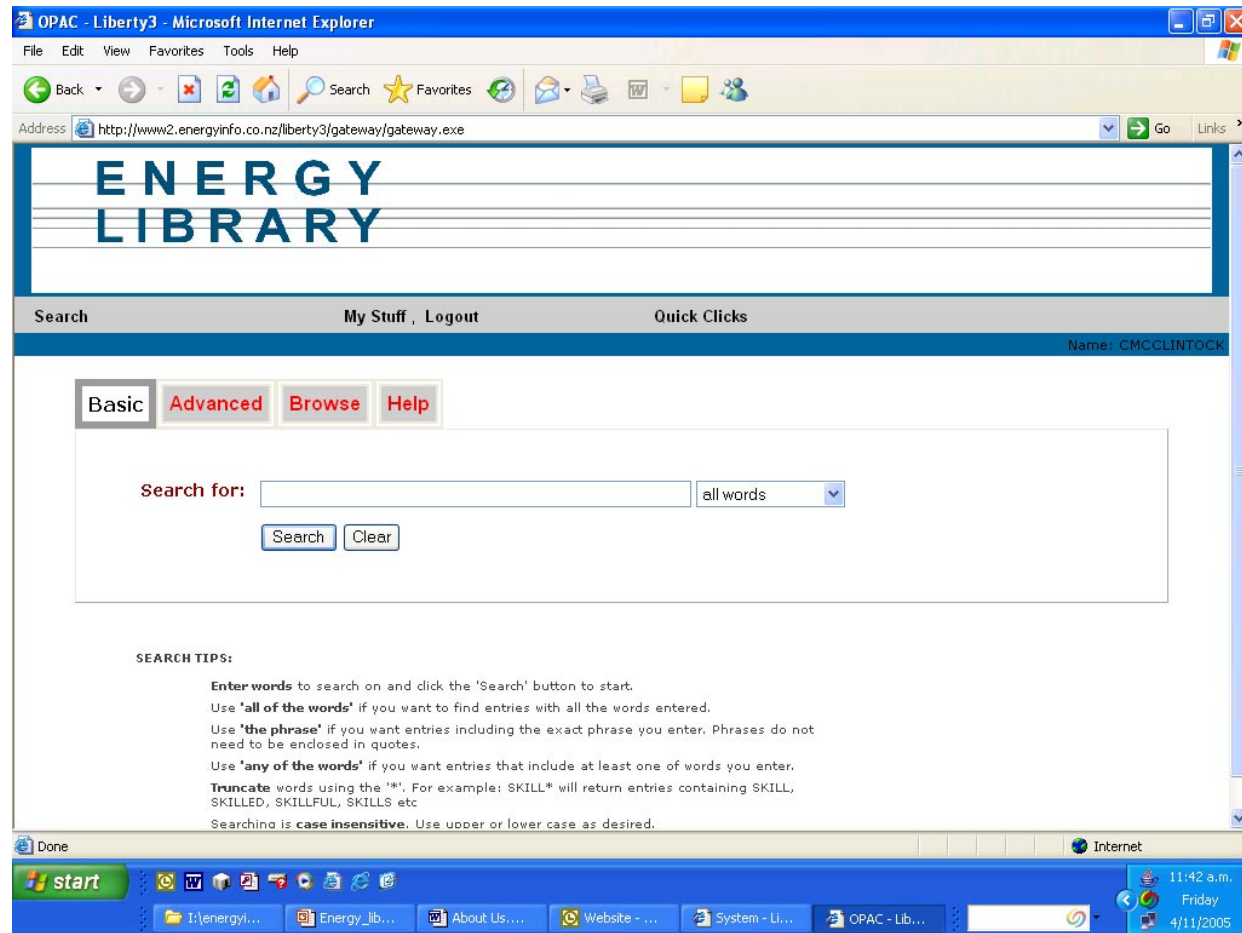
## How do you get information from us?

## Searching the library catalogue

### Advanced search

- Search by title, author, subject, date
- Limit by *type* of resource e.g. conference proceedings
- Limit by *location* e.g. Huntly



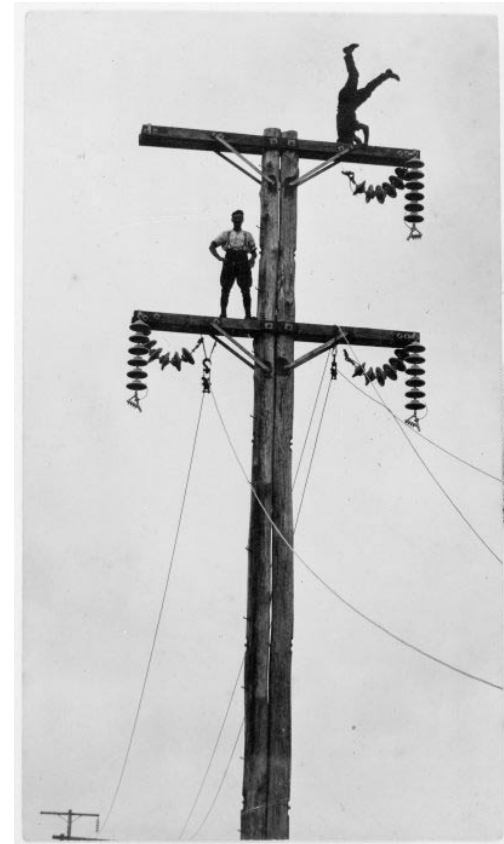

## Subject searches

We search on many different topics.

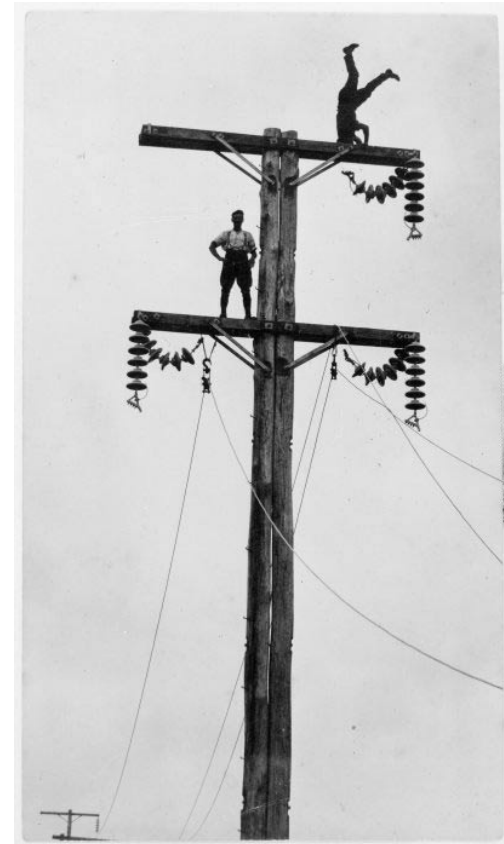
Examples of searches carried out recently include:

## What else can we do for you? **Topic Monitoring Service**

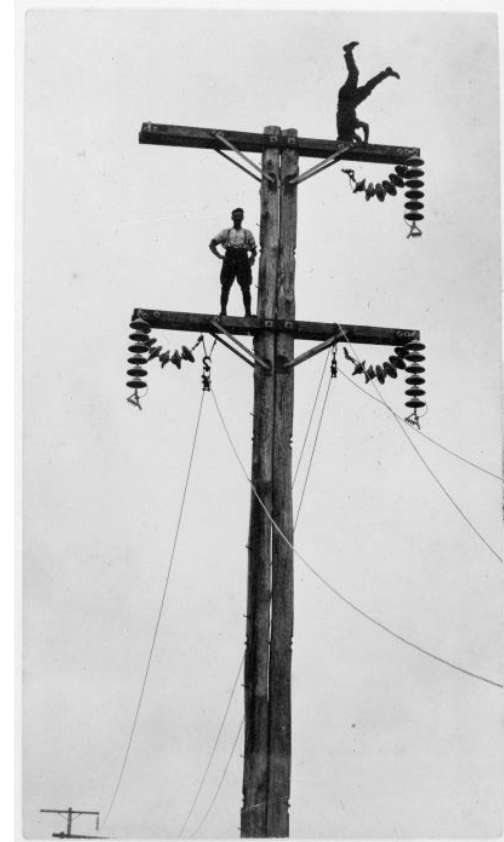
- Receive updates about latest research developments in your field.
- The service provides a monthly digest containing a list of articles with abstracts or links to abstracts on your subject of choice.



What else can we do for you?

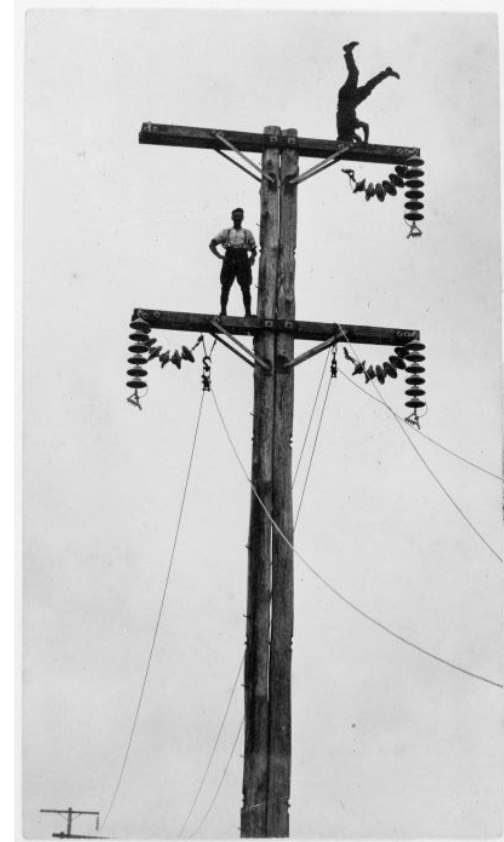
## Table of Contents

- We send you by email tables of contents from journals of your choice – not just our subscribed journals
- You can then request individual articles from us
- The advantage of this service is that you get new information immediately rather than waiting for journal circulation



## What else can we do for you?

- Journal circulation  
Search for available journals on the catalogue or ask us
- Purchasing on behalf  
We get discounts on purchasing that we can pass onto you
- Energy Library updates on new and free resources



## What if we don't have it in our collection?

- We can interloan from other libraries
- We can obtain information via our document supply services or online databases
- *Even if we don't have it in our collection, we can usually get it!*

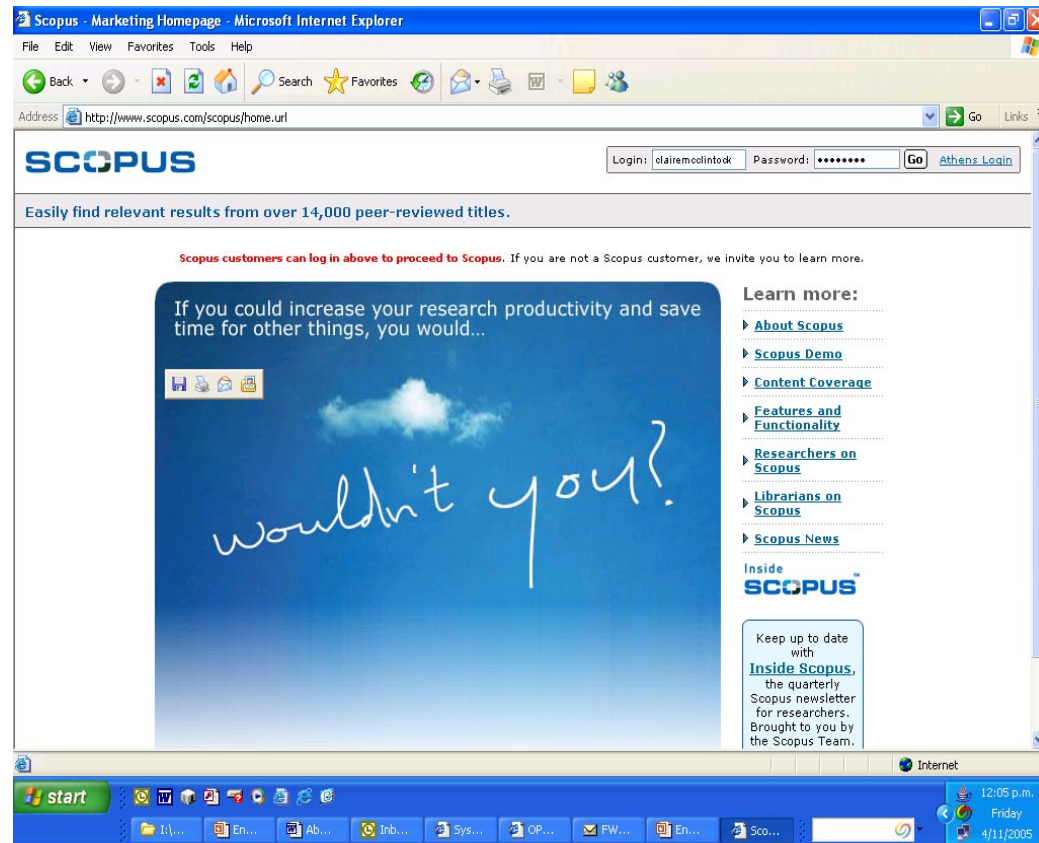
